

Proclamation

WHEREAS; construction and maintenance of our streets, highways, and utility infrastructure are critical to maintaining the state's economic vitality; and

WHEREAS; construction and maintenance of roadways frequently require that work zones be established; and

WHEREAS; work zones often have narrowed lanes, lane shifts, temporary pavement, and night work that require drivers to slow down and eliminate distractions to protect themselves and workers; and

WHEREAS; work zones also include locations where law enforcement vehicles, highway maintenance vehicles, emergency vehicles, utility vehicles, and tow trucks are operating on the side of a road with their lights flashing, requiring motorists to move over or slow down; and

WHEREAS; on average, Wisconsin annually suffers more than 1,600 crashes in work zones that injure nearly 700 people and kill eight;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Scott Walker, Governor of the state of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim April 11 – 15, 2016 as

WORK ZONE AWARENESS WEEK


throughout the state of Wisconsin and I commend this observance to all of our citizens.
