MOTOR-VEHICLE deaths in August 1972 totaled 5,200, an increase of 2 per cent over the August 1971 total of 5,100. The death figure for this August was the highest ever recorded for the month. August was the eighth month in succession in which motor-vehicle deaths were higher than in the same month of 1971.

Deaths for the first eight months of 1972 totaled 36,610, an increase of 4 per cent over the eightmonth figure for 1971 of 35,250, and surpassing the previous record high of 36,000 for the first eight months of 1969. Deaths for the 12 month period ending August 1972 totaled 56,060.

Disabling injuries for the first eight months of this year are estimated at nearly 1.3 million. These are injuries resulting in disability beyond the day of the accident, and do not include minor injuries which probably totaled as many more.

The cost of motor-vehicle accidents for the first eight months of 1972 is estimated at about \$10.3 billion.



A WORD FOR YOU AND ME FROM NO. 3



November preludes the anticipation and the joy of the Holiday Season, but it also brings the hazards and anxieties of bad weather driving. Don't let a moment of forgetfulness ruin the holidays for you, your family and the other fellow. Use extra caution on wet or icy pavement.

When the road surface becomes slippery, allow an extra interval and avoid abrupt turns, lane changes and acceleration or deceleration. Anticipate turns or speed changes and execute them slowly.

Remember - to escape that deadly winter skid, avoid:

Sudden stops Sudden turns Sudden acceleration

The defensive driver is always alert to anticipate accidents and takes the necessary precautions that will prevent them. He is doubly aware of poor weather conditions and makes allowances for reduced visibility and slippery roads caused by bad weather.

The Anonymous Driver

A prominent West German sociologist has suggested something that supports a theory we have long harbored. He feels that requiring name plates as well as number plates on cars could substantially reduce traffic fatalities.



"I was go-Driver stated: ing east on a two-lane street approaching an intersection controlled by a stop sign. At this time of day, the through street has two lanes of traffic southbound, and three lanes northbound. Traffic was heavy. I came to a stop and saw that traffic was backed up on the two southbound lanes, and also two lanes of the northbound traffic were backed up and stopped. The center lane (northbound) was still open. Some driver gave me the sign to come across. I started, and as I neared the open lane, I saw the car coming and stepped on the gas to get out of her way. The motor was cold and choked up. At this time, the car hit me. I was moving about 5 mph and the car about 20 mph. I received a ticket for "failure to yield."

Well, mostly it's lack of foresight or failure to recognize a hazardous istuation. Sometimes, though, it's the result of taking a necessary risk. Here we present explanations for some such occurrances, taken from Section A of the AD-PERS-45 forms submitted to State Headquarters by our people:

- ⊙ I was attempting to herd a hereford cow off the East-bound lane of I-90 at the LaCrosse River Bridge when the cow charged me, knocking me down onto the pavement. The cow finally charged a semi head-on and was killed.
- I was in the process of changing a tire on a disabled Buick, Minnesota plates, two female occupants. I was changing the left front tire. The car was up on the jack. I was crouching in front of the wheel attempting to put the spare tire on the lugs when the car rolled off the jack towards me. The left fender above the wheel well struck me across both knees, knocking me down.
- O Cruiser parked in yard, next to driveway. Backing personal car out of garage, backed into fender of state cruiser.
- ② Had stopped to talk to a semi driver, to ask about registration, driver license and lettering. He struck me in the face and neck with his fists about three times before I was able to subdue him.
- I was assisting motorist (female) whose vehicle had overheated. I had removed radiator cap, woman's son put cap back on. I didn't think pressure had built up, so took cap off. I was burned by steam.
- I investigated a motor vehicle accident. In the process, I lit a fusee to protect the scene. The fusee sputtered and a hot, flaming piece of the fusee fell inside my shoe, burning a hole in my sock and causing a small blister on my foot.
- OI was off duty sleeping in my residence. I was not in the vehicle at time of accident.
- While taking photos of this accident, I became entangled in some barbed wire which cut into the calf of my right leg, tearing my trousers. The wire was all over the scene, for the car had smashed thru a fence.
- I was chasing a runaway juvenile on foot in a wooded area. We had left the road and were running in thick underbrush when I ran into a barbed wire fence that was covered with vines. I sustained ripped pants and wire cuts on my legs.
- While cleaning up in the troop room area, I picked up copper wire, folded and bent it for discarding. My thumb got into the wrong position resulting in a cut of the thumb on the left hand. It required three stitches.
- I got out of my cruiser and proceeded to go to the aid of the injured. I placed my right hand on a cement bridge support to go to where the car was. On this support was broken glass from the accident. This glass caused lacerations to the palm of my right hand.
- I went into scale and noticed the collar was off the base of the water jug on water cooler. I grabbed the jug to lift it and it broke in my hands cutting my right wrist requiring 6 or 8 stitches.

- We received a telephone call from State Radio advising of a personal injury accident. We paid our lunch bills and as I left the restaurant via the rear door, the door started to close. My left arm became impaled on the Lshaped door handle, at the crook of the arm. Went to scene of accident after releasing self from door handle, and from there to clinic. 3 or 4 stitches plus prescription . . .
- Oclosing the rear door of my cruiser, my fourth finger on my left hand got in the way when closing the door. Smashed fourth finger.
- I had stopped a subject for speeding. After he had cursed me at some length, he attacked me, causing bruises and abrasions to my person.



It is imperative that, in training, the student be given the opportunity to realize his own limitations as they apply to the equipment he is using, and that he so discipline himself as to never exceed these limits. It is only then that he will become a completely competent professional!

Accident of the Month:

DISCUSSION

The accident was classified as PREVENTABLE because any intersection movement must take into consideration all of the factors present. In this case, the driver was depending on others to get him through. He should have recognized the hazard of an open lane in congested traffic. An open lane is an invitation for use, and the driver should have approached this third lane expecting it to be used by a moving vehicle. His "panic" move of stepping on the gas was proof that he did not have his vehicle under control and ready to stop.





Has Death by Automobile Become Respectable?

Each year citizens of this nation engage in the needless, useless, senseless slaughter of 56,000 persons. How, you may ask, do so many persons lose their lives? Is it through war, or plague, or disease? Is it through a mass political purge?

It is one of these. Firearms are not the culprit. Atom bombs do not cause this wanton carnage.

The instrument of death each year to more than 56,000 is the family automobile.

A FAITHFUL servant. the motor car. It takes us on restful drives through the countryside. It transports us quietly over hundreds of miles to lakes and mountains and vacation spas. It brings our babies home from the hospital and delivers them to school when the weather is inclement. It carries us to and from work each day. It gives us mobility; the freedom to move about when and where we desire.

It also kills and maims us and our loved ones at a rate that is incomprehensible.

Does the death of 56,000 humans each year, plus the maiming and injuring of many times that many cause us to raise up in arms to deter this wanton destruction?

Not a bit of it.

Do we take advantage of safety features in automobiles to help guard ourselves from d i s a s t e r? By Sam Swartz Pioneer Press Editorial Staff

Again the answer is no.

THE NATIONAL Safety C o u n c i l estimates that more than 20,000 lives a year could be saved through use of seat belts. Yet, four out of five people, with seat belts installed in their autos, do not use them. They sit on safety and hurtle blithely toward eternity.

We have become so blase about automobile slaughter that unless it happens close to home, or in large numbers at one time, it is not even considered especially newsworthy.

These are accidents, we rationalize. An airplane passenger killed in any part of the world is news, even in single and twodeath crashes. These are accidents, too.

Why, then, is an airplane crash that kills one person in Africa news and a 'highway crash in Iowa, Illinois, North Dakota or South Dakota, that kills one person not news?

IF A MAN takes a knife or gun and kills his family it is murder. If he loads them in the family station wagon and drives into a bridge pier at 90 miles an hour, it is an "accident."

* * *

IF A MAN touches a gun to his temple and

squeezes the trigger, he has committed the unpardonable sin, suicide. If he simply moves the steering wheel a few inches to the left when meeting a 20-ton semi-trailer, he was killed "accidentally."

The line between accident and suicide, accident and murder is indeed thin and barely intelligible, especially when viewed in the twisted wreckage of an automobile.

Has death by automobile gained respectability? Have we accepted it so completely that most of us will do nothing to prevent it? Have we become so apathetic that we simply do not care what happens to our friends, our neighbors, our own families?

If a man commits murder by shooting another, does he not also commit murder if he consumes too much alcohol, climbs into his car and smashes into an innocent motorist, causing his death?

* * *

DOES HE not also commit murder if he drives faster than the speed limit and causes an "accident" that takes another's life?

More than 50,000 persons will die this year on our highways. Will we be appalled? Will we demand that the government "do something" about it? Will we fasten our seat belts?

After all, they are "accidents."

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


On an average of 32 times a day, a train and a motor vehicle tangle at one of the nation's 220,000 grade crossings. The train almost never loses!

- In terms of total 1971 production, Toyota was the largest foreign manufacturer of cars, trucks and buses, but Volkswagen led in car production. In worldwide automotive production, GM came in first, Ford second and Chrysler, seventh.

- Environmentists are getting overenthused. A book called The Earth Tool Kit, put out by Environmental Action, Inc., contains the statement, and I quote: "Highway pavement covers approximately four million square miles of land in the United States." Now, this is an interesting statement, when any encyclopedia will tell you that the total land area of the U.S. is only 3.6 million square miles, including inland waterways. So, if The Earth Tool Kit is correct, we have somehow managed to pave over every inch of ground in the country and annexed four hundred thousand square miles of somebody else's pavement.
- The Federal Bureau of Motor Carrier, in an attempt to save lives, promulgated the following rules regarding seat belts:

By July 1, 1972, all trucks manufactured since 1965 and operating in interstate or foreign commerce must have seat belts installed for the driver's and right seat positions -buses must have them installed for the driver's seat position. The regulations require drivers to wear those belts. Investigators of the Bureau are conducting a concentrated enforcement program against those drivers who refuse to buckle up.





FOND DU LAC (P) — Fond du Lac Circuit Court Judge Jerold E. Murphy Friday sentenced Michael F. Lewis, 16, Princeton, to a 5 to 25 year term at the Green Bay State Reformatory for the slaying of a state patrolman.

The judge called the sentenc, ing "probably one of the most difficult things the court has had to do for some time."

LEWIS WAS convicted of second degree murder Nov. 16 for the Aug 26 shooting death of Donald P e d e r s o n, 31. Green Lake.

The defendant will be eligible for parole after two years.

Judge Murphy told him "the length of incarceration will not be determined by the court but by the policies and practices of the **Division of Corrections** and by your own conduct."

STATUTES P R O V I D E for sentencing on second degree murder convictions for terms of not less than five years nor more than 25 years. The judge remarked it appeared to the court that Lewis' contention of self-defense was "totally rejected" by the jury.

HAD THE jury believed the defense contention that Lewis shot Pederson because he thought Pederson was coming at him with a gun, it would have been almost mandatory that it return a finding of manslaughter, the judge said.

Judge Murphy also said if the jury had returned a finding of guilty of first degree murder, he would have had to sustain that verdict based on the evidence.

The presecution had contended Lewis laid a trap for Pederson who had ticketed the youth for speeding earlier that evening.

CLINTONVILLE — Ice too thick for a boat but too thin to support the weight of a man caused a serious problem for members of the Volunteer Rescue Squad here Saturday.

The men, headed by Fire Chief Ed DuFrane were called to rescue a dog that had gone through the ice on Pigeon Pond late in the morning.

The dog, Bart, an 8-year-old springer spaniel owned by the Richard Gusserts of route 3, Clintonville, apparently went out onto the ice to chase a duck that had landed in a patch of open water.

At some distance from shore, the dog went through the ice and was unable to pull itself out.

Mrs. Gussert was alone with her children, Peter 6, and Andy 3, at the time. She pulled on hip boots and tried to go out into the water but then decided to seek assistance.

She phoned the police department and rescue squad members responded to the call.

They brought along the rescue boat but the thick ice made its use difficult. DuFrane waded to within a short distance of the dog and was able to get a ladder, which was sent out to him under the dog to support it until the men could get the boat to it.

The dog was in the water for approximately 30 minutes but apparently suffered no serious aftereffects. He was kept at the veterinarian's overnight and returned home Sunday. Gussert, a State Traffic Patrolman, had gone deer hunting Saturday.
