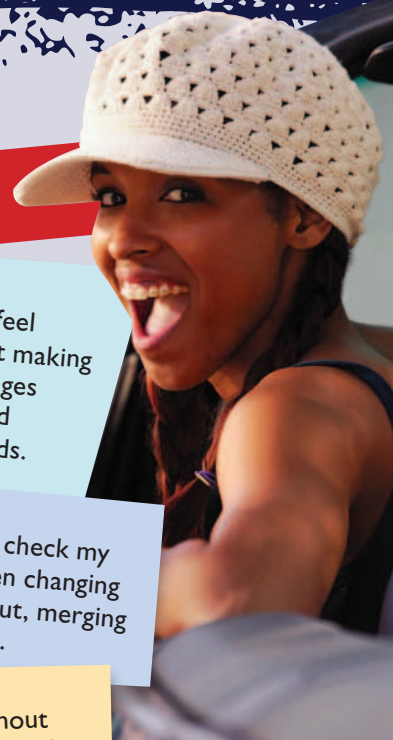

# My Road Test Check List



Before scheduling your road test at [www.wisconsindmv.gov](http://www.wisconsindmv.gov), have you prepared enough for it?

Check the boxes when you're proficient.

I feel confident making lane changes at low and high speeds.

I always check my blind spot when changing lanes, pulling out, merging into traffic, etc.

I consistently select the correct lane without coaching.

I drive without requiring instruction from my accompanying driver.

I know where all controls are and how to use them: headlights, emergency brake, mirrors, cruise control, etc.



I consistently adjust my speed for weather or traffic conditions, emergency vehicles, road construction, etc.

I "read" each intersection upon approach, know its type (uncontrolled, all-way stop, right-turn no-stop, etc.) and what I should do.

I feel confident driving on all roads at low or high speeds in light, moderate or heavy traffic.

I consistently prepare to stop, drive through or turn when approaching a controlled intersection.



I can skillfully parallel-park, make a Y-turn, drive in reverse in a straight line for 6 to 8 car lengths and park my vehicle to within a foot of the curb.

I can drive safely on busy roads and keep up with traffic without speeding.

I have discussed this checklist and my progress with the people who've helped me practice and learn to drive. They also feel I am ready to take the skills test.
