
Workers are certified for the RPP program:

STATUS UPDATE >

The development of The Milwaukee Streetcar is moving forward following city approval and additional funding in February 2015. Final design of the Phase 1 route is nearing completion and with the announcement of a \$14.2 million federal TIGER grant, further Lakefront Line planning will also soon be underway. The Request for Proposals (RFP) for streetcar vehicles was issued and selection of a vehicle vendor, U.S.-based Brookville Equipment Corp., is complete. In 2016, RFPs will go out for building the system's main line, operations and maintenance facility. Mainline construction is expected to start in spring 2016, and The Milwaukee Streetcar is slated to begin serving area residents, workers and visitors in 2018.
