Public involvement meetings set for Coulee Region Transportation Study

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) Southwest Region office in La Crosse will hold the third round of public involvement meetings to discuss the Coulee Region Transportation Study. The meetings are scheduled for the following:

The meetings will provide a review of study activities and next steps in the year-long Planning and Environment Linkages (PEL) process to examine transportation in the area. Details of the public input gathered to date, the broad strategies developed and the roadways currently being evaluated will be discussed.

The meetings are open to the public to review study materials, ask questions, and provide comments. WisDOT project staff will be available to gather input.

Additional meetings are anticipated to be held in November.

The PEL report is expected in 2016. There are no plans or construction projects scheduled at this time. Construction of any improvements recommended cannot be considered until the PEL and subsequent environmental impact study are completed.
