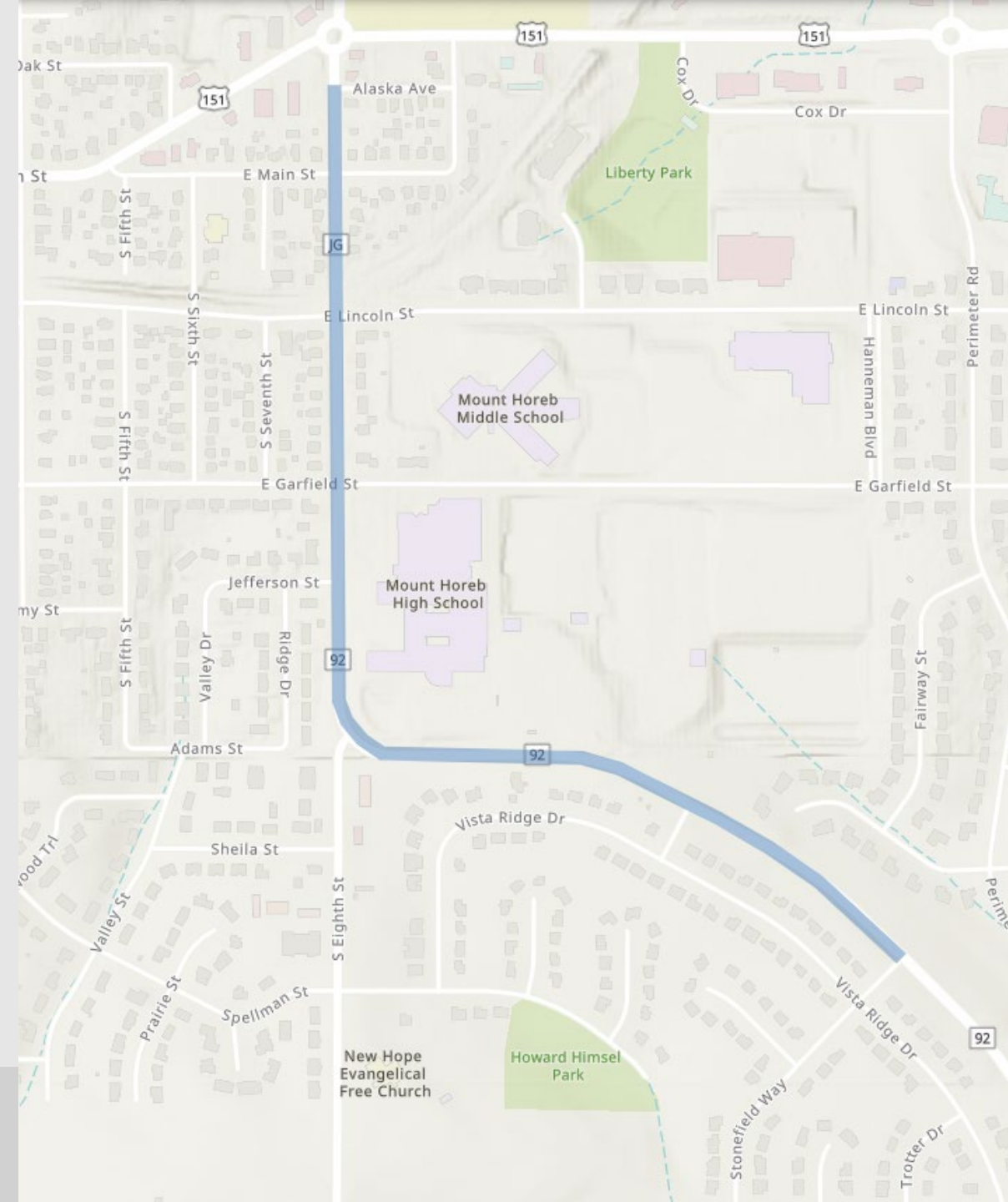

- 0.93 miles of WIS 92
- Alaska Avenue – Stonefield Way
- Village of Mount Horeb, Dane County



Project purpose and need

Pavement deterioration

- Pavement condition:
 - Last resurfaced in 1989
 - Extensive weathering, longitudinal and transverse cracking
- Impact of deterioration:
 - Cracks allow water and chemicals to penetrate, accelerating roadway deterioration
 - Poor ride quality and frequent maintenance
 - Increased expenditures to maintain the roadway



Project purpose and need

Curb ramp deficiencies

- The existing curb ramps do not meet the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards
- This impacts the safety and accessibility of pedestrian crossings
- Importance of ADA Compliance:
 - ADA compliance is integral to promoting inclusivity and ensuring equal access for all pedestrians, including those with physical and visual disabilities

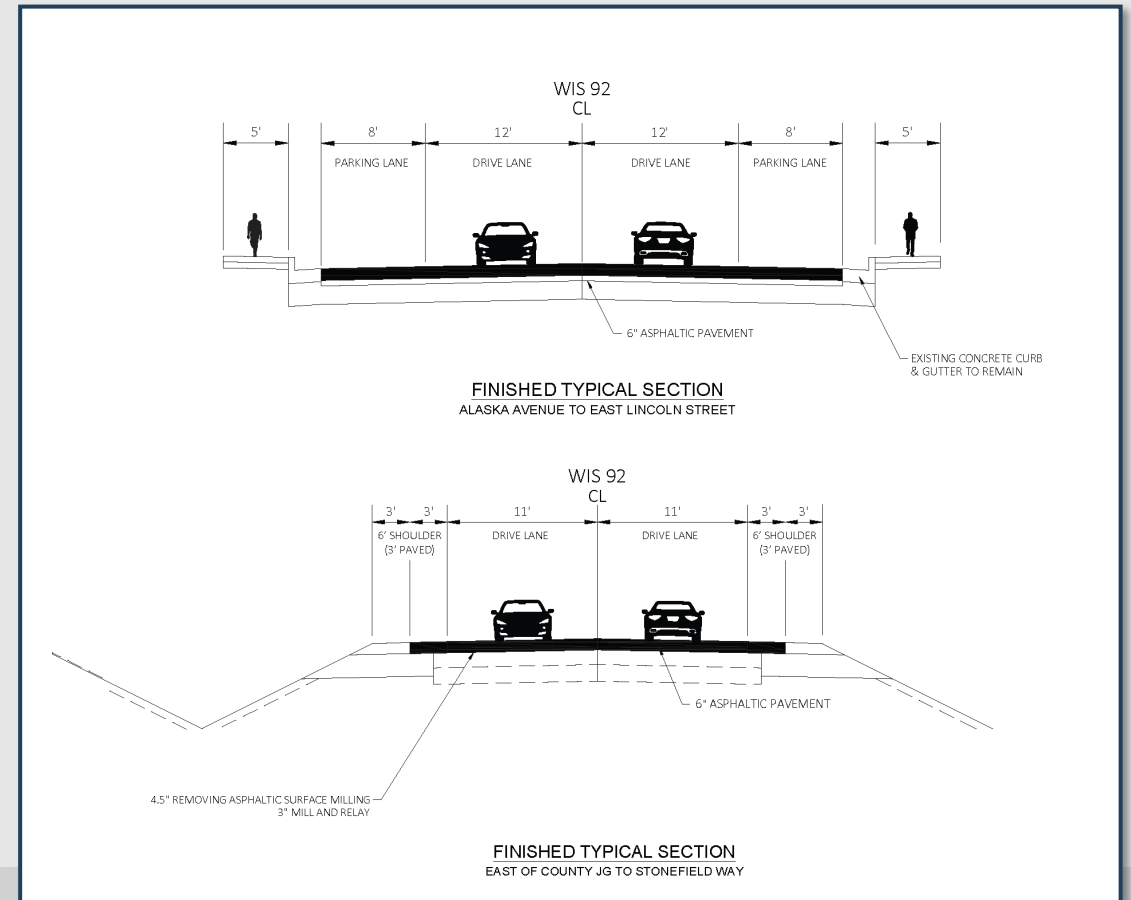


Proposed improvements

Design overview

- Pavement

- Remove existing concrete and asphalt pavement
- Replace with new asphalt pavement
- Select areas of excavation below subgrade (EBS) may be required
- Existing curb and gutter would remain
- New pavement markings



Proposed improvements

Design overview

- Upgrade the existing curb ramps to meet ADA standards for accessibility
 - Correct the slope
 - Correct the width
 - Provide level landings
 - Add detectable warning fields

Property impacts

- Temporary Limited Easements (TLE) and permanent right of way (FEE) may be needed for curb ramp construction
- WisDOT real estate staff will begin coordination with property owners for any permanent or temporary real estate needs in spring 2025

Property impacts

Section 4(f)

- Temporary limited easements (TLE) are proposed at the Military Ridge State Trail
- Access to the trail will be maintained with temporary pedestrian ramps and a temporary ADA compliant surface around the construction area



Military Ridge Trail West



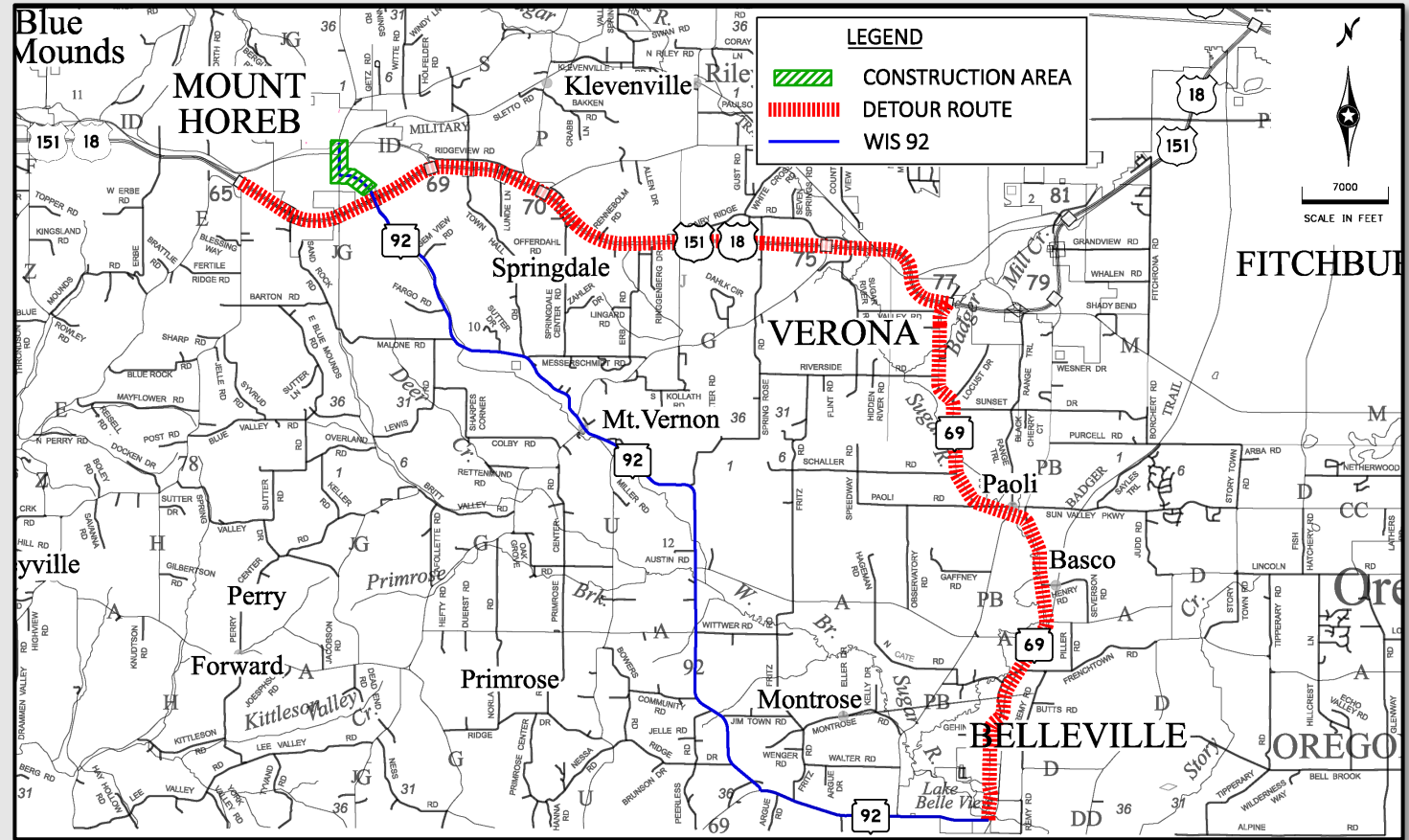
Military Ridge Trail East

Section 4(f) properties are publicly owned parks, recreation areas, wildlife or waterfowl refuges and any significant historical or archeological sites



Traffic impacts

- WIS 92 will be closed to through traffic during construction
 - The proposed detour route will utilize WIS 69 to US-18/151 to WIS 78
- Access to local properties and businesses will be maintained
