With three full months of the contest in and computed, the first report of standings can be made. The first quarter leader is District No. II, with no 1973 fleet accidents. Second, and solidly in contention with no accidents but lower total mileage, are District No. VI and District No. IV. Incidentally, VI has let it be known they intend to put the Director's Trophy "back where it belongs".....

The current fleet accident picture shows a profound deviation from the 1972 experience. Last year, when the waning hours of March 31 finally ran out, our fleet had recorded 48 accidents for the first quarter. In 1973, for the same first-quarter period, our total fleet involvements numbered 26! We look to that as a sign of change--for the better.





Recent incidents occurring around the nation during the past couple of years point up something that we as police people should recognize---getting careless or lazy can get us killed.

With the increasing number of assaults on the police, it would be well for each of us to concentrate on correct procedures that can very well avert tragedy!





BUREAU OF MOTOR CARRIER SAFETY BULLETIN THE GRAVEYARD SHIFT

It's 3:00a.m., your eyelids hang heavy and the passing white lines appear blurred. You feel fatigued but you just left the terminal at 11:00p.m. You approach a turn. You shut your eyes for just a moment--''the graveyard shift'' has claimed another victim.

In a recent study intitled "The Relationships Among Fatigue, Hours of Service, and Safety of Operations of Truck and Bus Drivers prepared for BMCS, it was clearly shown that there are marked daily variations in the level of driver alertness with the lowest levels occurring, for most individuals, between about 2:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m.

Most of the drivers surveyed in the study were found to be on irregular driving schedules that required them to drive frequently (but not regularly) during this period. For many drivers, whose runs ended during these hours, the psychological effect of driving at this time of day was combined with the fatigue effect. This most certainly is a hazardous combination and in an analysis of accidents involving reportedly ''sleepy or inattentive'' drivers, over 50% occurred during the hours between midnight and 8:00 a.m.

A driver can feel no fatigue and yet not be alert. He may experience lapses of attention and exhibit low responses to signals or signs he should respond to rapidly. A lack of alertness may be due to a variety of factors, none of which is necessarily related to physical fatigue: boredom, monotony, drowsiness, or simply a lack of interest.

The probability of having an accident due to sleepiness or inattention is much greater between 2:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m. than at any other time. Do all you can to stay alert. Stop frequently, have a cup of coffee, walk around, stretch your legs, open cab windows, chew gum, or anything else to stay alert.

Drivers must <u>STAY ALERT TO STAY ALIVE</u> particularly when driving during 'the graveyard shift''.


Decision rendered by the Accident Review Committee.



Decision

This accident is PREVENTABLE and could have been avoided in a number of ways if the driver had been operating defensively. First, he should have approached the intersection in the proper lane for a left turn. Secondly, he was depending on his left turn signal being seen and obeyed by the other driver. Thirdly, he saw the vehicle behind him before he signalled his turn but apparently never checked again before making his turn. Thus, he lost sight of a potential danger, which was a grave error. Had he looked again, he would have seen the car coming up in the left lane.

Motor-vehicle deaths in Janu-ary 1973 totaled 4,000, a decrease of 3 per cent from the January 1972 total of 4,120. Last year's January figure was the highest ever recorded for the month.

Disabling injuries during the month are estimated at about 140,000. These are injuries resulting in disability beyond the day of the accident and do not include minor injuries which probably totaled as many more.

The cost of motor-vehicle acci-

dents for the first month of this year is estimated at slightly more than \$1.1 billion.

Preliminary vehicle mileage estimates for January are not yet available. Therefore, no mileage death rates have as yet been calculated for 1973,


