The transportation team at NCHC is a paratransit service that provides public transportation for persons over 60 or persons with disabilities. Access to this service is limited to persons whose physical or mental disability prevents them from riding Metro Ride buses or the WATS Paratransit Program. The transportation's service was designed to meet the needs of clients that live outside of the public transportation (city buses) service area or those that are in need of door-through-door services who do not have other resources for transportation.

Due to other resources available, we do not provide transportation for Medical Assistance or Family Care clients. Our service area is outside the Wausau Area Paratransit Program to the Marathon County Line.

All Metro Ride busses are equipped with wheelchair lifts or ramps to provide accessibility for persons with limited mobility. Riders who do not use a wheelchair, but are unable to climb steps, may request to use the lift to board the bus. Each bus has two wheelchair securement locations. Public transportation has been part of the fabric of our community for many years, dating back to the first street cars in 1906. Much has changed over the years, but our objective - to provide safe, reliable, affordable, basic mobility has remained unchanged. Today, Metro Ride provides accessible city bus service for the public, as well as paratransit service for people with disabilities.
