Driver Escort Program: 608-647-4616 Primarily for medical app. trips. Offers assistance within 85 miles of Richland Center. Now known as Eagle Country and includes services for Juneau, Sauk and Crawford County.

Veterans Service Office: The Richland County Veterans office works with the Driver Escort Program to provide transportation to Veterans based on Various factors. Call 608.647.6101 to see if you are eligible for co-pay assistance thru our office.

Medical Assistance/Badger Care: Persons on Medical Assistance or Badger Care may contact MTM, Inc. at 866-907-1493 for transportation to their medical appointments.
