## Transportation Services

**SENIOR EXPRESS ABILITY MINI BUSES:** The Shawano County Aging and Disability Resource Center's mini-buses serve citizens over 60 years old and those who are disabled. There are two buses that provide transportation for shopping, medical appointments, special trips, and attending congregate meal sites. To make a reservation to ride the bus, please call the Shawano County Aging and Disability Resource Center at 715-526-4700 **one day in advance**. Call *toll free* from western Shawano County or eastern Shawano County, 1-866-526-2130.

**USER SIDE SUBSIDY:** Discounted cab rides in the City of Shawano for elderly and disabled citizens. Tickets are sold in booklets of ten at the Shawano City Hall, which is located at 127 South Sawyer Street, Shawano, WI (715-526-6138). Booklets are \$17.50.

**HOME-DELIVERED MEALS:** This program provides balanced meals to people who are home-bound, unable to shop for groceries, and have no other way to have a meal prepared for them. Hot meals are available Monday through Friday and are delivered mid-day. Frozen meals are available for weekends. The recommended donation is \$3.50 per meal. All meals provided through the Aging and Disability Resource Center are available on a contribution basis as required by the Older Americans Act.
