In Wisconsin Rapids, bus transportation is provided Monday through Friday with routes running through Nekoosa and Port Edwards to Wisconsin Rapids. Pick-up times begin around 8:15 from the rider's home. The bus is equipped with a wheelchair lift.

Rural shopping trips are provided on the south end of the county (Wisconsin Rapids area) on the first and third Thursday of each month. This includes the area surrounding Wisconsin Rapids.

The program also offers Door-To-Door Service to riders. This service includes carrying parcels to the first entryway, when needed. Please call with your transportation request by 12 noon, Monday through Friday, the day before you need your ride to allow time to schedule your service.

The program also offers Door-To-Door Service to riders. This service includes carrying parcels to the first entryway, when needed. Please call with your transportation request by 12 noon, Monday through Friday, the day before you need your ride to allow time to schedule your service.

Volunteer Driver Transportation Program

The Wood County Volunteer Transportation Program is available to those who:

- Are on medical assistance

- Do not have a vehicle
- Do not have a friend or family member who can drive them
- Are not physically disabled
- Do not have a serious criminal history
- Do not have a serious mental or behavioral condition

To request transportation to a medical appointment, at least five business days before your appointment, call an Economic Support Specialist at your local Social Services office.

You will receive notice by phone or mail when a volunteer driver has been assigned. You will also receive a written or phone notice if no driver is available. The Volunteer Transportation is not a guaranteed service; some restrictions and limitations do apply.
