TRANSPORTATION MOVES WISCONSIN

Wisconsin's transportation infrastructure has come a long way over the last century. It has developed from a system of two-lane roads and highways, grass landing strips, wooden piers and locomotives, to a network of multi-lane divided highways, airports, modern water ports, efficient transit systems and rail lines linking the state with markets throughout the world.

Transportation touches the lives of nearly everyone every day. Whether traveling to work, school, or to a favorite vacation spot, Wisconsin's transportation network provides the means to get there.

As part of a new WisDOT initiative - "Transportation Moves Wisconsin" - Secretary Mark Gottlieb conducted a statewide tour featuring a series of town hall meetings in April and May 2014. He highlighted the important role and growing needs of the State's transportation system and requested public input on how to fund those needs into the future. These are issues critical to the future of both the transportation system and the Department's work.

ABUSERS OF MINORITY PROGRAMS BEWARE

The Federal Transit Administration Office of Civil Rights (FTA OCR) openly accepts complaints from any person that believes that a recipient of funds used in connection with federally supported transportation projects has failed to comply with its obligations under 49CFR Part 26. In order to file such a complaint, one must do so within 180 days after the date of the alleged violation or date on which the complainant learns of a continuing course of conduct in violation of this part.

A recent story in [The Hartford Business Journal](#) by Dr. Fred McKinney, President and CEO of the Greater New England Minority Supplier Development Council, addresses a situation which may have risen to the attention of the FTA OCR in just such a manner.

[The Hartford Business Journal](#) story published highlights a \$2.4 million forfeiture and changes in the management team and structure agreed to by a specialty contractor -- after its admission of fraud related to a federally funded road-building project in Connecticut. The column is appropriately titled, "Abusers of minority programs beware," as it focuses not just on the penalties levied against one firm, but suggests it is a solemn reminder to those that would defraud legitimate DBEs out of the intended purpose of the DBE program -- which is to increase economic opportunity and participation by disadvantaged businesses on federal contracts. WISDOT DBE OVERALL ANNUAL GOAL PUBLIC PARTICIPATION MEETINGS

On highway construction projects, the overall annual goal for the last three years was 11.9%. WisDOT ended FFY 2012 and 2013 with a DBE Percent Committed at 13.26% and 13.76%, respectively. As of March 2014, the total DBE Percent Committed is 11.04% as shown in Table 1 on the following page.

September 30, 2014 will mark the end of the WisDOT Triennial Overall DBE Goal of 11.9%.

Beginning in February 2014 WisDOT staff began gathering data and preparing documents to review with stakeholder groups. From March to June WisDOT leadership and members of TRANS-AC and TRANS-CAC advisory committees convened to discuss and debate the new Overall Triennial DBE Goal for FFY 2015 to 2017.

When the new triennial DBE goal is established, the DBE Program staff will publish a 30-day notice announcing WisDOT's proposed overall goal and give the public 45 days from the date of the notice to submit any comments. We will also host a series of public participation meetings in June and July at targeted community associations and in the megaproject regions: SE, SW and NE. The proposed Triennial Overall DBE Goal for FAA, FHWA, and FTA will be available for review, inspection, and comment until July 22, 2014 at the following address:

A mega project is an extremely large-scale investment project typically defined as costing more than \$1 billion. Megaprojects attract a lot of public attention because of substantial impacts on communities, environment, and budgets. To address these issues, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation has facilitated stakeholder advisory committees on each of its megaprojects and spearheaded the development and oversight of DBE contracting reports/updates to demonstrate its commitment to transparency, the DBE program, and its Overall Annual DBE Goal.

These reports provide data on construction contracts, design engineering and construction management for the Total Amounts and DBE share. WISDOT DBE Support Services (DBESS)

WisDOT DBE Support Services are an integral component of the WisDOT DBE Program. DBE Support Services (DBESS) utilizes both State and Federal funds to implement services provided to WisDOT primes and DBE contractors and consultants depending on the service requested. DBESS consultants are awarded contracts based on their level of expertise, commitment, and knowledge of the DBE Program to provide support services directly to DBE firms either in a training format or on a one-on-one basis. These services include the Mobilization Loan Guaranty Program, Financial Technical Assistance, Legal Services, Outreach and Marketing, and Technical Assistance. Listed below are upcoming DBESS trainings for WisDOT DBE firms.

WISDOT DBESS Training

DBE Orientation

DBE Orientations are planned meetings for newly certified and potential DBE firms who desire to do business with the Wisconsin Department of Transportation. At a DBE Orientation, a firm will receive information on the DBE Program components such as the DBE certification process, DBE Support Services, and the DBE commitment process. The attending firms will learn how to utilize the WisDOT *Doing Business* website and WisDOT administrative processes such as bidding and letting procedures, Additional Special Provisions, and the DBE goal setting processes. A WisDOT DBE Program specialist will host a DBE Orientation in your region upon request.



Post Contract Award

The purpose of the Post Contract Award training is to educate DBE firms on WisDOT's expectations after they win a contract or subcontract. The trainer will give a general overview of bidding and estimating, focus on the importance of communication with your Prime, and discuss the value of attending Preconstruction conferences. DBE firms will also learn what documents are required to complete and submit during the term of a contract, and what are the best practices used in this industry.

DBE contractors or consultants who attend this training are eligible for 5 hours of one-on-one technical assistance in bidding and estimating by M Squared Engineering.

This training will focus on how to minimize disputes between the parties of a contract. How to Write a Business Plan

All businesses in the midst of change need a business plan. That includes those in startup, survival or growth modes. Certainly, anyone seeking to hire new staff members unifies its leadership team around a common mission or those seeking any financing will find this training invaluable. The Business Plan Development seminar is a two-day course for contractors, consultants, specialized transit service providers, and airport concessionaires.

THE TrANS PROGRAM: WISDOT'S AFFIRMATIVE INVESTMENT IN WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) is responsible for planning, building and maintaining Wisconsin's network of state highways and the Interstate highway system.

The Transportation Alliance for New Solutions (TrANS) program is WisDOT's investment in promoting equity and access to the potential new workforce generated by our projects. WisDOT awards the TrANS contract through a competitive process that selects the winning provider based on qualifications, compliance with proposal requirements and pricing. We are happy to announce the winning TrANS service provider for DOT's Southwest Region, Forward Service Corporation.

As the TrANS provider for the I-39/90 Corridor Expansion Project, Forward Service Corporation has the responsibility of recruiting, training, placing and retaining community residents who've expressed an interest in highway construction careers located in the areas impacted by the mega project, primarily for those residing in both Rock and Dane Counties. Forward Service Corporation is charged with sharing information about the road construction industry and the TrANS program with interested residents throughout DOT's southwest region.

This year, Forward Service will focus on interested candidates referred to them by WisDOT's stakeholder partners including Community Action of Beloit and Construction Workforce Diversity Alliance of Dane County. Working cooperatively, they will identify and assess TrANS training recruits while referring ineligible candidates to appropriate community networks for support or assistance when needed. Next year, Forward Service Corporation will expand their outreach efforts more broadly.

Forward Service Corporation will conduct four (4) TrANS classes over the next twelve months alternating between Beloit and Madison. The minimum eligibility requirements are: 18 years of age and older, a valid driver's license, the ability to successfully pass a drug screen and pass a math and reading competency test above 8th grade.

The six-week, 160 hours of instruction includes traffic control or flagging procedures, 10 hours of an OSHA Construction Safety training, CPR and First Aid, test preparation for a construction apprenticeship exam and the commercial driver's license written exam.

For 2014, the program goals are as follows:

- 150 candidates screened for training
- 100 candidates trained for placement
- 65 candidates placed into road construction jobs and/or careers

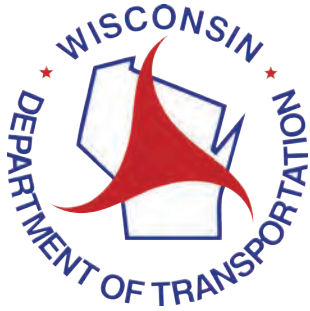
