
WisDOT Celebrates Good Faith Effort

The progress WisDOT has made with Good Faith Effort (GFE) requests has been both significant and meaningful. As the chart indicates, there was a time where GFE requests were in the triple digits; simply stated – Wisconsin was underachieving and an outlier in the country. Meeting the assigned DBE goal at bid time was not the norm and the term "Good Faith Effort Waiver" was commonplace. Much has happened in the last three years to the point that WisDOT now reports a **95.00% decrease** in GFE requests from FFY 2018. The FFY2023 number is YTD through May 2023.

How did this happen?

During a Technical Assistance visit in 2019 from FHWA's Office of Civil Rights, WisDOT was instructed to find ways to reduce the GFEs received and approved, which in turn required WisDOT to create new practices including retooling the GFE evaluation process. During this same time, bid letting documentation requirements were changed from the responsible model to a responsive model. This meant all bidders were required to identify and provide DBE commitment documentation at bid time. At the beginning of FFY2022, the DT1202 Excel Workbook and other GFE resource documents were created so prime contractors could more efficiently document their GFE efforts – WisDOT also recommended and encouraged prime contractors to adopt other process changes such as:

- Develop a comprehensive GFE/DBE strategy
- Update DBE solicitation letter(s) and/or their website
- Highlight DBE successes
- Actively participate in a variety of DBE outreach efforts



This layered approach slowly shifted the mindset in the prime contractor community and the results speak for themselves. Not only is there a dramatic decrease in GFE requests, but after-contract DBE utilization is significant as well as shown below which allows us to lower assigned goals:

- FFY 2021 \$20M
- FFY 2022 \$29M
- FFY 2023 \$11M YTD through May 2023

Lastly, during the summer of 2022, the DBE Office visited prime contractors throughout the state; we heard from many that as they updated their processes to meet assigned DBE goals at bid time, more internal teamwork resulted. WisDOT has come a long way in the last six years; it has been a **collective** effort amongst many different stakeholders that at times created unique challenges. We look forward to continued success for all DBEs who are now routinely awarded subcontracts **and** are valued industry partners.

Bid Letting and Quoting Reminders

- When working with new primes reach out early and introduce yourself and what you do.
- Need a capability statement? The **DBE Office** can help!
- Haven't worked on WisDOT jobs for a while? Check in with primes you've worked with before to let them know you are interested and available.

The DBE Office receives consistent feedback from prime contractors that the following are the **top three areas to improve with respect to quotes.** We are highlighting this feedback so that you can optimize your internal processes.

- If some of your work items receive DBE credit and some do not, **make it clear** to the prime on your quote.
 - Review your NAICS codes on the <u>Directory</u>.
 - Consider requesting an <u>expansion</u> for any work area you perform but do not receive credit for.
- Send quotes to primes as **early** as possible before a letting.
 - Prime contractors are under strict deadlines on letting day- make sure you give them enough time to properly evaluate your quote.
 - Sending quotes in early helps your company receive adequate consideration and prime contractors to submit responsive bids.
- Complete your <u>Attachment A</u> with the amount you can receive total credit for and the amount of your full quote and sign it.



Highway Construction Skills Training (HCST)

Preparing Workers for Success in Road Construction

Highway Construction Skills Training (HCST) was previously called the Transportation Alliance for New Solutions (TrANS). The program was renamed in February of 2023. HCST works with over two dozen partners across the state and over 800 HCST graduates have been placed with employers as laborers or apprentices.

HCST is a six-week intensive training program that prepares workers for careers in the road construction industry. HCST also works with program graduates to find employment and ensure their continued success. The HCST program works to create opportunity for groups historically underrepresented in the construction industry, including women and people of color.

HCST is a program that sets you up for success entering the construction workforce. Enrolling in the training is free. After you graduate, HCST providers will work with you to find employment.

HCST participants come from diverse backgrounds, including labor, retail and other types of employment. We are looking for candidates with a work ethic and willingness to learn.

In order to create an effective learning environment, each HCST class contains no more than 20 candidates. Participants undergo an intensive 120- hour soft and hard skills preparation program that includes instruction from industry professionals, road construction contractors, and experienced road construction employees. Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) <u>Secretary Craig</u> <u>Thompson</u> and Wisconsin State Patrol Superintendent Tim Carnahan joined federal, county and local officials to urge people to drive safely in work zones throughout Wisconsin this construction season. <u>Watchnews conference about Work Zone Awareness.</u>

Each year, more than 2,400 crashes happen in Wisconsin work zones, putting workers and motorists' lives at risk. At the news conference, a highway worker shared a personal story about his experience working just a feet away from highway traffic. We all play a role to keep work zones safe. "Work zones are temporary, but our decisions behind the wheel can make an impact forever," WisDOT Secretary Craig Thompson said. "The people working behind the barrels rely on us to drive safely. Glancing at a text or social media alert while driving is not worth it. Let's work together to avoid distractions and stay focused on the road ahead. Safe drivers create safe work zones."

How can people help?

- Drive safely. Be courteous, put the phone down and obey posted speed limits.
- Move over, or slow down, when you see workers and vehicles with flashing lights along the highway. Wisconsin's Move Over Law applies to maintenance operations as well as emergency response units.
- Show support for work zone safety with the social media hashtags #WorkWithUs, #NWZAW, #WorkZoneSafety, or #Orange4Safety (but please never text and drive).
- Watch the Safety Minute series from WisDOT staff who stress the importance of being alert on the roads – both as a driver and worker – and to always expect the unexpected.
