Connecting Highway Aids (CHA)

Statutory Authority: § 86.32 Admin. Rule: N/A

Objective: To reimburse municipalities for actual costs associated with the traffic control and maintenance of certain designated routes of the state highway system existing in a municipality.

Eligibility: Municipalities with marked routes on the State Trunk Highway system over the streets and highways within their jurisdiction which are designated as connecting highways.

- 117 municipalities receive quarterly Connecting Highway Aids payments on a per lane mile basis, with rates varying according to population.
- Municipalities receive the entire aid rate per mile for the two center lanes on a connecting highway, 75% of the aid rate per mile for the next two lanes and 50% of the aid rate per mile for any additional lanes. No payment is made for lanes in which parking is allowed.
- The lane mile rates are specified in the Wisconsin Statutes 86.32(2)(am)8. Current rates per lane mile are:

10,001 35,000	\$8,525
Under 10,000 population	\$7,345
