




# Project Goals


- Improve Safety

# Proposed Bridge Improvements


- Replace bridge deck and approaches
- Repair support structure
- Paint steel components of the bridge
- Provide improved wider pedestrian accommodations







# Proposed Intersection Improvements


- Shift left turn lanes
- Extend US 10 WB auxiliary lane 500 feet
- Change US 10 EB to I-39 NB to free flow
- Signalize I-39 NB ramp intersection
- Install a traffic signal head over each lane
- Update curb ramps
- Proposed Work

# Traffic Impacts


- Stage 1
  - Off peak lane closures
  - WIS 66 EB to I-39 SB turn lane
  - Nighttime ramp closures

# Traffic Impacts

- Stage 2 & Stage 3
  - I-39: Periodic lane closures
  - US 10/WIS 66
    - Three lanes; two EB, one WB
    - Temporary signals
- Stage 2
- Stage 3


STAGE 3 TRAFFIC

# Traffic Impacts

- Stage 4
  - Off peak lane closures
  - Nighttime ramp closures

# Traffic Impacts

- Ramp Closures
  - I-39 NB to US 10 EB ramp closed during bridge construction
- Access to I-39 restricted to right turns
  - Detour will use adjacent interchanges




# Construction Timeframe

- Construction is currently scheduled to begin spring 2022
  - Bridge painting may occur fall 2022 or spring 2023
