Purpose of Public Involvement


- To inform members of the public about the proposed project
- To update members of the public about changes to the proposed project since the last Public Involvement period
- To obtain feedback from the public on the proposed improvements





Project Location

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) is planning pavement rehabilitation for 13.1 miles of WIS 29 from Highline Road to the Brown County Line



















Project Information – Purpose and Need

- Purpose
 - Address the deteriorated pavement condition in order to extend the service life of the roadway
- Needs
 - Roadway deficiencies
 - Culvert deficiencies
 - Safety





Project Information – Alternatives Considered

- Alternative 1 No Build
 - Maintain existing facility with no improvements other than routine maintenance
- Alternative 2 Pavement Replacement
 - Replace the WIS 29 pavement along the entire project corridor
- Alternative 3 Preservation / Restoration (Rehabilitation)
 - Repair deteriorated joints along with spot improvements throughout project corridor
 - Preferred alternative





- Repair or replace the concrete pavement joints and cracks (repairing versus replacing the joint/cracks will depend on the severity of joint deterioration)
- Resurface the asphalt shoulders on WIS 29 within the concrete joint repair sections
- Replace the asphalt shoulders to full depth on the WIS 29 and WIS 55 interchange ramps
- Replace the concrete pavement to full depth at the following locations:
 - WIS 29 Westbound (WB) from 2000' west of River Road to just east of Broadway Road
 - WIS 29 Eastbound (EB) from County F to Spruce Road





- Replace the concrete pavement to full depth and add additional base course at three culvert pipe locations under WIS 29 where the pavement has settled resulting in dips
- Reconfigure the WIS 29 and E Slab City / County BE intersection to restrict movements to right-in / right-out movements only
- Repair and clean five culvert pipes under WIS 29 along with cleaning and clearing of brush from the ditches
- Replace the guardrail systems along WIS 29 and WIS 55






- Resurface WIS 55 from County S to just east of the WIS 29 WB entrance ramp
- Resurface the Park-n-Ride parking lot located on Lot Lane west of WIS 29 and just south of County S






WIS 29 Existing Typical Section







WIS 29 Proposed Typical Section – Pavement and Joint Repair


















WIS 29 Proposed Typical Section – Pavement Replacement

















Project Information – Environmental Awareness

- Environmental Document
 - Currently being prepared
- DNR Initial Review
 - Received Environmental conditions will be incorporated and accommodated
- Archaeological and Historical Impacts
 - Project placed on Section 106 Screening List No potential for adverse effects
- Wetland impacts
 - Wetlands impacts will be avoided and/or minimized to the greatest extent practicable
 - Unavoidable wetland losses will be compensated for in accordance with the DNR/DOT Cooperative Agreement and the WisDOT Wetland Mitigation Banking Technical Guideline















Proposed Traffic Impacts


- Traffic Impacts During Construction:
 - WIS 29 will remain open to traffic at all times using single lane and shoulder closures, crossovers, and bidirectional traffic
 - The WIS 29 and WIS 55 interchange ramps will be closed to traffic with a signed detour
 The detour will be in place for the shortest duration possible
 - WIS 55 will remain open to traffic utilizing lane closures and flaggers
 - The Park-n-Ride will be closed to traffic for a short term
 - Temporary driveway closures will be necessary during parts of the construction process
 Homeowners and businesses will be contacted in advance before closing a driveway





Proposed Traffic Impacts

- Detour Route while WIS 29 and WIS 55 Ramps are Closed
 - WIS 55 to WIS 156 to WIS 32
