The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) is proposing to rehabilitate I-43, from Brown Street to Capitol Drive, in the City of Milwaukee. The purpose of this project is to address deteriorating pavement and bridges, make safety improvements, and improve traffic flow. The project improvements aim to maintain safe and efficient vehicular movement along the I-43 corridor.


## **PROJECT DETAILS**

The proposed project will rehabilitate the existing pavement and add auxiliary lanes to give drivers more distance to enter and exit the freeway which improves safety and operations. All improvements will stay within existing right-of-way. The following bridges over I-43 will be repaired and painted, extending the life of the bridges: Brown Street, Wright Street, Center Street, Locust Street, and Burleigh Street.

# PROJECT UPDATE SINCE SUMMER 2021

A public meeting was held in September 2021 where a proposed alternative showed a merge transition lane near the North Avenue curve. That proposed lane extension was removed from consideration due to design challenges and as a response to public feedback.

Removing the merge transition eliminates the need and opportunity for a noise barrier study. Noise barriers will no longer be considered for this project.
