

Project Location




















Why do we need this Project?

- The pavement is weathered, rutted, and cracked.
- End terminals on guard rails do not meet current standards.



















Proposed Improvements

- Overlay existing pavement to extend service life.
- Maintain existing roadway width, shoulders, and alignment.
- Replace guard rail and guard rail end terminals, as needed, to meet current standards.






Proposed Improvements

 Perform rehabilitation work on 4 structures:

Structure ID	Proposed Action
B-52-144	Drip edge & surface repairs.
B-52-51	Repair scour countermeasures, replace or pull back SW wing and remove sediment from box.
B-52-66	Repair east drip edge. Repair SE, NE, and NW wings. Surface repairs.
B-52-85	Drip edge repairs.

















What will happen to traffic?

- STH 171 will remain open to traffic during construction and will be controlled with flagging operations.
- Minor delays will be expected.
- Access to driveways and local roads will remain open.





What happens next?

- 1. February 2022: Gather public input
- 2. June 2022: Anticipated Preliminary Design & Environmental Process Complete
- 3. November 2023: Final Plans Complete
 - Construction Scheduled for 2024
