- Project Length: 5.17 Miles


















Project Summary Project Location



















Project Purpose and Need

- The WIS 67 pavement is aged and showing signs of deterioration. The project is needed to extend the service life of the pavement, improve the driving surface, and reduce future maintenance.
- In addition, there are three culverts that are deteriorated and in need of replacement, the guard rail at the WIS 67/Davy Creek bridge is substandard and in need of replacement, and there are several curb ramps that are not up to Americans with Disability Act (ADA) requirements.






Proposed Improvements

- Mill and overlay 3 1/2 inches of asphalt pavement
- Replace the existing guardrail at the WIS 67/Davy Creek bridge
- Replace three deteriorated pipe culverts
- Update curb ramps as needed to meet Americans with Disability Act (ADA) requirements
- Replace the existing railroad crossing surface and signals at the Union Pacific Railroad at-grade crossing





Anticipated Traffic Impacts

- The project will be closed to through traffic and a detour route will be posted. The detour route is still being determined, but will be finalized during the design process
- Access to adjacent properties and for first responders will be maintained during construction. Brief interruptions in access may occur temporarily at driveways. The contractor will be required to notify homeowners and businesses prior to construction.





















Real Estate Needs
