Purpose of the public involvement materials

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) is planning improvements to 3.5 miles of WIS 67 from WIS 28/County TW north of Theresa to County H/Church Street in Lomira, located in Dodge County.



The purpose of the materials is to familiarize you with the details of the project, answer questions, and listen to your comments, concerns, or suggestions. This handout is a supplement to the presentation and exhibits available on the project website.

Project information

The WIS 67 asphalt pavement is deteriorating with longitudinal and transverse cracking. The project is needed to improve the pavement condition and extend the serviceable life of the pavement.

Proposed improvements include: milling the existing asphaltic pavement and overlaying it with 4-inches of new asphalt, reshaping of the existing base aggregate shoulders, installing centerline rumble strips, and new pavement marking.

The environmental document for this project is currently under development by the project team and is expected to be completed this spring.

Proposed traffic impacts

Construction is scheduled to occur in 2023.

WIS 67 will remain open to traffic during construction. Construction will take place utilizing short duration single lane closures with flaggers. The final traffic control concepts will be refined by the design team as the project progresses.

Access will be maintained for residents to the greatest extent possible. Limited exceptions to driveway access are expected during work operations immediately in front of access points; however, these times of restricted access are anticipated to be infrequent and well communicated in advance of any access-restricting work. Specific access needs can be communicated now with the design team or with the Department's field representatives during construction.

Real estate

Real estate acquisitions are not anticipated. All construction activities are expected to remain within the existing right of way.
