Participants have the opportunity to earn three levels of awards.



UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEMS (UAS) UAS are quickly becoming major users of the National Airspace System.

All UAS operators are reminded to review FAA regulations regularly and to remain well clear of manned aircraft operations at all times.

Model Aircraft Operations Only hobby or recreational flights can qualify as model aircraft operations.

All model aircraft weighing between 0.55 lbs. and 55 lbs. must be registered with the FAA. Individuals flying model aircraft are expected to follow safety guidelines, which include: + Fly below 400 feet and remain clear of surrounding obstacles

- → Keep the aircraft within visual line of sight at all times + Remain well clear of and do not interfere with manned aircraft operations
- → Don't fly within 5 miles of an airport unless you contact the airport and control tower before flying
- → Don't fly near people or stadiums
- → Don't be careless or reckless with your unmanned aircraft -you could be fined for endangering people or other aircraft

Any UAS operation for compensation or conducted in support of a business activity is considered a civil UAS operation. Civil UAS Operators must receive written authorization from FAA prior to flight. Unmanned aircraft used for Civil UAS operations must also be registered with FAA. For further information: www.FAA.gov/UAS
