## **ADDENDUM NO. 01**

**3050-01-77**

**April 8, 2026**

### **Special Provisions**

#### **3. Prosecution and Progress.**

*Replace entire article language with the following:*

Begin work within 10 calendar days after the engineer issues a written notice to do so.

Provide the time frame for construction of the project within the 2026 construction season to the engineer in writing within a month after executing the contract but at least 14 calendar days before the preconstruction conference. Assure that the time frame is consistent with the contract completion time. Upon approval, the engineer will issue the notice to proceed within ten calendar days before the beginning of the approved time frame.

To revise the time frame, submit a written request to the engineer at least two weeks before the beginning of the intended time frame. The engineer will approve or deny that request based on the conditions cited in the request and its effect on the department's scheduled resources.

The Notice to Proceed will be issued such that work shall start no earlier than July 20, 2026, and no later than August 3, 2026, unless otherwise approved by the engineer.

#### **Structural Work**

The structural work is expected to begin after the migratory birds nesting period.

#### **Paving Operations**

Do not place live traffic on milled surfaces for longer than 96 hours due to the thickness and condition of the milled surface. A milled surface is prohibited during the time periods specified in the Holidays and Special Events article.

#### **Crawfish River**

New riprap at the abutments of Crawfish River Bridge (B-28-10) will be hand placed into the original lines of the existing riprap to avoid work in the Crawfish River. No new riprap will be placed in the Crawfish River. No in water work (including people/equipment hand placing riprap below the OHWM) in the river is permitted from March 1st – June 15th.

#### **Migratory Birds**

Swallow or other migratory bird nests have been observed on or under the existing structure(s). All active nests (when eggs or young are present) of migratory birds are protected under the federal Migratory Bird Treaty Act. The nesting season for swallows and other birds is from April 15 to August 31.

The department is responsible for determining feasibility of egg/young salvage and will coordinate the transfer of eggs/young to a federal and state permitted wildlife rehabilitator prior to impactful work on the structure, as necessary. The department has coordinated with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) regarding anticipated active nest take resulting from construction activities. The engineer will complete any required follow up notification to USFWS for FAST Act compliance.

### **Protection of Endangered Bats (Tree Clearing)**

Federally protected bats have the potential to inhabit the project limits because they roost in trees, bridges and culverts. Roosts may not have been observed on this project, but conditions to support the species exist.

The species and all active roosts are protected by the federal Endangered Species Act. If an individual bat or active roost is encountered during construction operations, stop work, and notify the engineer and the WisDOT Regional Environmental Coordinator (REC).

Ensure all operators, employees, and subcontractors working in areas of known or presumed bat habitat are aware of environmental commitments and avoidance and minimization measures (AMMs) to protect both bats and their habitat.

Direct temporary lighting, if used, away from wooded areas during the bat active season April 15 to October 31, both dates inclusive.

The department has contracted with others and will perform the following operations after October 31 and prior to April 15:

- Cutting down and removing trees.
