Local Bridge Improvement Assistance Program (Wis. Stats. s.84.18, Trans 213)

Program Overview:

- Provides federal or state funding for up to 80 percent of the cost to replace or rehabilitate deficient local bridges.
- Bridges must be structurally deficient or functionally obsolete and have a sufficiency rating of less than 80 for rehabilitation and less than 50 for replacement.
- Projects are solicited every two years for overlapping 4-5 year forward-looking periods.
- Projects are selected based on a statewide rating and ranking process specified in statute and administrative rules.
- Project ratings are based on the amount of funding requested and the county's share of statewide local bridge needs.
- All projects are state let by statute (s.84.18(6)). Project oversight is conducted by WisDOT region staff as responsible charge for compliance with Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and state requirements.

Program Funding:

- 2017-19 Biennium \$48,727,400 FED, \$37,996,900 SEG
 - Includes one-time transfer of \$1,025,700 SEG from repealed traffic marking program.
- An additional \$30.0 million SEG and \$8.6 million FED were transferred into the program based on action by the Joint Committee on Finance in SFY 2018.

Challenges:

- Cost effective delivery of projects.
- Balancing statewide needs with the preferred scope of individual projects and sponsors.

Policy/Budget Opportunities:

- Adoption of a risk-based project oversight model.
- Allow local contract letting and/or project delivery for low-risk projects.
- Implement performance based practical design standards to ensure facilities meet purpose and need while minimizing unnecessary costs.
- Evaluate project type and eligibility criteria to ensure cost-effective and valuable projects are not excluded from the program.
