

NHTSA issues final rule permitting electronic odometer disclosures

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) announced a <u>final rule</u> establishing standards under which states may allow for electronic odometer disclosures.



The rule has yet to be officially published, and DMV is still reviewing the rule and its impact. Here are a few of the highlights of NHTSA's electronic odometer disclosures:

- Resets exemptions so that vehicles that are 20 years old or older (rather than 10) are exempt from mileage reporting
- Allows both physical and electronic titles and powers of attorney
- Defines "Access," "Electronic Power of Attorney," "Electronic Title,"

 Allows authorized modifications to electronic records

The final rule has not been published and becomes effective 90 days after publishing. DMV is analyzing the changes and their impact on Wisconsin's laws. The most notable and immediate change will be the odometer exemption change from 10 years to 20 years. Based on the table provided in the final rule, this will impact 2010 vehicles which won't become exempt until 2030.

DMV will provide additional guidance as it becomes available.

Policy change for APU Title and Registration corrections

Beginning December 1, 2019, the Business & Consumer Services Unit will no longer accept correction requests when a title or registration is processed correctly from information on the original paperwork. Any change that varies from the original paperwork is a new application, not a correction.

Change requests that were originally correct will be handled as new transactions and will require the appropriate forms and fees.

Any ownership or lien changes, additions or removals should be processed as a new application to comply with Wis. Admin. Code chs. <u>Trans 141</u> and <u>Trans 148</u>.

Dealers and lenders should work collaboratively to ensure each has the necessary document to process the new applications. Dealers and lenders should be aware a \$5 processing fee and \$20 surcharge may be required for WisDOT to process these title transactions. Are your customers REAL ID ready?

Beginning October 1, 2020, the regular Wisconsin driver license or ID will no longer be accepted identification for domestic air travel or to enter a federal building or military base.

Wisconsin's REAL ID-compliant driver licenses and IDs are marked with a star:



Non-compliant cards don't have the star or are marked "NOT FOR FEDERAL PURPOSES." wisconsindmv.gov/realid

Account activity alerts added to DMV's eNotify online service

eNotify is the easiest way to get plate renewal and driver license/ID reminders through email or text.

Subscribers to eNotify also receive alerts when certain transactions occur, such as when an application for a duplicate driver license or ID card is made, or when their address is changed in DMV's systems. wisconsindmv.gov/enotify

Illinois Out-of-State Dealer policy

An August Illinois Secretary of State memo has new requirements for Out-of-State dealers and auctioneers.



All Illinois certificate of titles or rebuilt titles for vehicles that are sold to out-of-state dealers or out-of-state wholesalers must be stamped in 36-point font, on the front of the title and on the back in the reassignment area, with either of the following:

"NOT FOR RESALE WITHIN ILLINOIS" or "NOT FOR RETAIL SALE WITHIN ILLINOIS"

This created a significant number of issues for Wisconsin dealers who sell vehicles to Illinois customers.

After Wisconsin and several other states expressed this concern, Illinois officials issued the following revisions:

- Beginning October 15, 2019, Illinois certificate of titles or rebuilt titles for vehicles sold in Illinois to non-Illinois dealers or wholesalers for less than \$5,000 and weighing less than 12,000 pounds MUST BE MAILED to a non-Illinois address.
- No titles may be handdelivered or transferred at the time of sale; the title must be mailed to the non-Illinois dealer's or wholesaler's home jurisdiction address.
- The previously issued title stamping requirements are repealed.

Emissions testing in winter

Cold weather can affect evaporative systems, which may prevent a vehicle from passing the emissions inspection. The outside air temperature affects the fuel volatility and the amount of vapor formed in the tank.

Motorists whose vehicles are due for emissions inspections in winter may test within 180 days of the vehicle registration due date. This can help avoid testing in cold weather and potential monitor readiness issues.



If readiness issues persist, and the vehicle is in a county that requires emissions testing, the motorist can get help by calling the Wisconsin Vehicle Inspection Program (<u>WIVIP</u>) hotline at 1-866-OBD-TEST (1-866-623-8378).

Registration can only be transferred after 30 days

Wisconsin dealers will register vehicles in the dealership's name for a variety reasons. Wisconsin law will only allow a license plate to be transferred to another vehicle after it's been valid for 30 days. If a dealership wants to register a vehicle, it can either transfer a plate that has been valid for over 30 days or obtain new registration.

Title only applications

Due to increased fraud and the circumvention of existing registration laws, DMV recently changed its policy for accepting title-only applications.

DMV Customer Service Centers will no longer issue title-only applications when the vehicle was sold by a licensed Wisconsin dealer. Dealers need to mail these applications in for manual processing.

Dealers or dealer runners will no longer be given the title for a titleonly application being issued to a customer. DMV Customer Service Centers will still process the application and collect the fees, but the title will be mailed to the customer.

This does not apply to vehicles being titled into the dealer's name, replacement titles, heirs, or other special circumstances with the proper supporting documentation.
