DBE Basics



- Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) provisions apply to USDOT (including FTA) assisted contracts
- FTA planning, capital, and/or operating assistance spent on contracts
- WisDOT Transit DBE program addresses FTA funded contracting activities by WisDOT and subrecipients

DBE Objectives



- Ensure nondiscrimination in the award and administration of DOT-assisted contracts
- Create a level playing field on which DBEs can compete fairly for DOT-assisted contracts
- Help remove barriers to the participation of DBEs in DOT-assisted contracts
- Promote use of DBEs in all types of DOT-assisted contracts and procurement activities

What is a Contract?



- Contract A mutually binding legal relationship obligating a seller to furnish supplies or services (including construction) and the buyer to pay for them.
- Contracts include a subrecipient's contract with a vendor or contractor, including procurement by purchase order or purchase by credit card, which is financed with FTA assistance.
- Contracts do not include grants and cooperative agreements.

Goals and Goal Setting



- Overall Transit DBE goal are established by the WisDOT Transit Section every three years
- Goal = 1.61% Race Neutral
- The WisDOT Transit Section's proposed 1.61% race neutral goal is effective October 1, 2022 to September 30, 2025
- Contract specific goals are established as needed to assist in attaining overall goal

DBE Provisions



- Contract Assurance
 - o Adhere to 49 CFR Part 26
 - Condition of receiving FTA assistance
 - o Requirements applied at contract level
- Transit Vehicle Manufacturer Certification
 - Separate DBE program for TVM
 - TVM definition
 - Process, Contract clause, Certification

DBE Provisions (continued)



Prompt Payment

- Applies to all contracts with subcontracts
- Payment by Prime Contractor to their subcontractors
- o Within 10 calendar days
- o Includes return of retainage

Bidders List

- o Comprehensive list of vendors bidding on Transit contracts
- Used in goal setting

Procurement Process



- Contract solicitations are initiated by Subrecipients with the WisDOT Procurement Manager
- Procurement Manager ensures current DBE contract language included in solicitation documents
- No contract awards proceed without Procurement Manager signoff

Contract Goals



- Upcoming contracts are reviewed by WisDOT Transit
 Staff for suitability of a contract goal
 - o Does the contract have subcontracting opportunities?
 - Are there ready, willing, and able DBE firms?
 - Has the WisDOT's overall transit DBE goal been met?
- Contract or Discretionary goal are established
 - Additional solicitation requirements
 - o Bidders to achieve contract goal, or
 - o Demonstrate Good Faith Efforts to achieve goal
 - Once contract is signed, goal now becomes a contract commitment

Contract Solicitation



- Standard DBE Contract Clauses
 - Included in all WisDOT and subrecipient solicitations
 - A total of five items covered in the DBE Contract Clauses
 - Clauses vary depending on whether a contract specific goal is established for the procurement
 - The Procurement Manager will provide the correct set of clauses



Notice of DBE requirement and statement of goal

With a Contract Specific Goal

This contract is subject to the requirements of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 26, Participation by Disadvantaged Business Enterprises in Department of Transportation Financial Assistance Programs. The national goal for participation of Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBE) is 10%. A separate contract goal of _____% DBE participation has been established for this procurement.

Without a Contract Specific Goal

This contract is subject to the requirements of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 26, Participation by Disadvantaged Business Enterprises in Department of Transportation Financial Assistance Programs. The national goal for participation of Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBE) is 10%. The recipient's overall goal for DBE participation is 1.61%. A separate contract goal has not been established for this procurement.



Contract Assurance

With or Without a Contract Specific Goal

The contractor shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin or sex in the performance of this contract. The contractor shall carry out applicable requirements of 49 CFR Part 26 in the award and administration of this DOT-assisted contract. Failure by the contractor to carry out these requirements is a material breach of this contract, which may result in the termination of this contract or such other remedy as the recipient deems appropriate, which may include, but is not limited to:

- 1. Withholding monthly progress payments;
- 2. Assessing sanctions;
- 3. Liquidated damages; and/or
- 4. Disqualifying the contractor from future bidding as non-responsive.

Each subcontract the contractor signs with a subcontractor must include the assurance in this paragraph (see 49 CFR 26.13(b)).



DBE Participation

With a Contract Specific Goal

Bidders/offerors are required to document sufficient DBE participation to meet these goals or, alternatively, document adequate good faith efforts to do so, as provided for in 49 CFR 26.53. Award of this contract is conditioned on submission of the following prior to award:

- •The names and addresses of DBE firms that will participate in this contract;
- •A description of the work each DBE will perform;
- •The dollar amount of the participation of each DBE firm participating;
- •Written documentation of the bidder/offeror's commitment to use a DBE subcontractor whose participation it submits to meet the contract goal;
- •Written documentation from the DBE that it is participating in the contract as provided in the prime contractor's commitment; and
- •If the contract goal is not met, evidence of good faith efforts to do so.

Bidders/Offerors must present the information required above prior to contract award (see 49 CFR 26.53(3)).

Without a Contract Specific Goal

The successful bidder/offeror will be required to report its DBE participation obtained through race-neutral means throughout the period of performance.



Prompt Payment

With or Without a Contract Specific Goal

The contractor is required to pay its subcontractors performing work related to this contract for satisfactory performance of that work no later than 10 calendar days after the contractor's receipt of payment for that work from the {insert agency name}.

In addition, the contractor is required to return any retainage payments to those subcontractors within 10 calendar days after the subcontractor's work related to this contract is satisfactorily completed.



DBE Subcontractors

With or Without a Contract Specific Goal

The contractor must promptly notify {insert agency name} and WisDOT whenever a DBE subcontractor performing work related to this contract is terminated or fails to complete its work, and must make good faith efforts to engage another DBE subcontractor to perform at least the same amount of work.

The contractor may not terminate any DBE subcontractor and perform that work through its own forces or those of an affiliate without prior written consent of the {insert agency name} and WisDOT.

Reporting on Contracts



- Was a contract specific DBE goal established for your project/procurement to:
 - Buy stuff?
 - Build stuff?
 - Plan stuff?

If yes, then you will be instructed to submit a quarterly DBE report to WisDOT.

- DBE subcontracts
 - Progress toward goal
- Prompt payment to subcontractors
 - Log of payments

Subrecipient Requirements



- Initiate contract solicitations with Procurement Manager with ample time to address requirements
- Coordinate with WisDOT staff when separate contract goal is established
- Submit quarterly contract reports on time, if applicable
- Attend to record keeping on an ongoing basis
- Seek assistance from WisDOT staff with DBE questions

WisDOT Requirements



- Program Managers collect and compile Quarterly Contract Reports
- Procurement Manager assists in completing procurement process through contract award
- DBE Compliance Manager handles goal setting, reporting to FTA, and contract boiler-plate language
