FIELD OBSERVATION OF SEATBELT USE IN WISCONSIN June, 2005




Since March 1987, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation has conducted periodic statewide observation surveys of seatbelt use. Wisconsin enacted a mandatory seatbelt law in December 1987 and a mandatory child safety seat law in May 1992.


RESULTS

In June 2005, 73.3% of passenger vehicle occupants (front outboard*) used their seatbelts.


*Front outboard refers to the driver and the right front seat passenger.

(Note: The chronology on the graph is not to scale due to irregularity in collection dates.)






Belt use is highest (96.0%) among children 0-4 years of age. This includes child safety seat use. However, a 16-month, nationwide study completed in 2002 by the National Safe Kids Campaign showed that approximately 82% of child safety seats are used improperly in the vehicle, creating a situation where a child would be at increased risk of injury in the event of a crash.



Belt use is the lowest (66.1%) among drivers ages 16-25. This group represents 16.5% of licensed drivers, yet accounted for 29.1% of drivers involved in crashes in 2004.

Wisconsin has consistently displayed a gender difference of more than 10% in safety belt use.

In the most recent survey, 80.1% of females were their belts, while only 68.1% of males did.





Belt Use by Region

Belt use varies by more than 11% across the state. The Green Bay/Appleton area is highest at 77.6%, and the Wausau/Rhinelander area is lowest at 66.1%.

Occupants of vans were most likely to be wearing their seatbelts. 80.4% of front seat van occupants wore safety belts.

Occupants of pickup trucks were least likely to use their belts. Little more than half (58.7%) of the occupants of pickup trucks wore safety belts.
